

CPT Cadman Kiker is a United States Army Officer assigned to the Judge Advocate General's Corps stationed at Fort Hood, Texas. He graduated cum laude from Piedmont College in 2011 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Philosophy and Religion. He then attended law school at Washington and Lee University. While a student at Washington and Lee, he was a member of the Virginia Capital Case Clearing House, where he drafted pretrial motions for capital cases. After graduating with a Juris Doctorate in 2014, he became a research fellow at Washington and Lee for the 2014-15 academic year, doing research and writing on subjects including electronic surveillance and police militarization.

CPT Kiker accepted a commission as a Judge Advocate in October of 2015 and arrived at Fort Hood in February 2016 as a Legal Assistance Attorney. Since then, he has served as an Administrative and Civil Law Attorney, Chief, Operational Law, Fort Hood, and as an Operational Law Attorney deployed in support of Combined Joint Task Force-Operation Inherent Resolve. While deployed, CPT Kiker advised the command on dynamic and deliberate targeting, self-defense, and the tactical and strategic equities associated with a crowded battle-space in Iraq and Syria.

After his return from the Middle East, CPT Kiker took over as the military prosecutor for the 3d Cavalry Regiment at Fort Hood.
